

**Village of Birnamwood  
Ordinance on Hunting Within Village Limits**

(1) Definition. For purposes of this section, a firearm is defined as any instrumentality from or with which a shot, bullet or pellet may be discharged or expelled, regardless of whether the propelling force is provided by air, spring or other mechanical device or gunpowder.

(2) a. No person may discharge or possess a firearm within 100 yards of any building devoted to human occupancy without the express permission of the owner or other lawful occupant of the building unless the firearm is unloaded and enclosed in a carrying case.

b. This paragraph shall not apply to any premises owned and operated by any public or private sportsman's range or club.

c. This paragraph shall not apply to uncased firearms within a building devoted to human occupancy

(3) a. Except as provided in (3b), no person shall discharge any arrows, stones, snowballs, BB's, pellets or other projectiles, whether by hand or use of bow, sling shot, spring or air gun, or other mechanical device.

b. The prohibition in (3a) shall not apply to such discharging when done on private property with the permission of the owner, under the supervision and in the presence of an adult, for target practice only, and where the projectile does not leave the private property where such target practice is being conducted.

(4) Any person violating a provision of this ordinance shall be subject to a forfeiture of not less than \$50.00 and not greater than \$150.00, plus additional costs authorized by law.

**Village of Birnamwood**  
**Ordinance for Snowmobiles/ATVs on Public Streets**

(1) No person shall operate a snowmobile or ATV, unless expressly authorized, upon any public right-of-way, in any public park, in any cemetery or on any other public municipal property in the village except as follows:

- a. Intent. The intent of this subsection is to provide a means for a person to travel from a residence and lodging establishment within the village limits for the shortest distance that is necessary for a person to operate a snowmobile or ATV to the snowmobile route or trail that is closest to that residence or lodging establishment. It shall be that person's responsibility to determine the shortest route.
- b. Speed. No person shall operate a snowmobile or ATV on any village street in excess of 15 miles per hour.

(2) Any person who shall violate any section of this article shall, upon conviction thereof, forfeit not less than \$20.00 and not more than \$500.00, together with the costs of prosecution.
